

The drawing below will give you some idea of what the barn looks like, although it was done before we decided to put windows in. The barn itself is 36 feet from front to back and 34 feet from side to side. There is a “run-in” shed on the right, where the horses get out of the sun and the rain. It is open on two sides and closed on the other two, and it adds another 14 feet to the width of the barn, for a total of 48 feet. The barn is 20 feet high at the top and 9 feet tall at the sides. That little jog in the right hand part of the roof is 14 feet off the ground and 24 feet from the right hand edge of the run-in shed. The doors are each 5 feet wide by eight feet tall. The hayloft door is 3 feet wide by 5 feet tall, and the windows are 3-1/2 feet by 3-1/2 feet. The back is just like the front, with two exceptions; there is no hayloft door, and the side of the run-in shed is closed, not open.
