## I. Call to Order

• Meeting was called to order at 6:34 on 11/21/2024

### II. New Business

Ms. Adkins reviewed the positions and identified who would serve in the following roles:

- Ms. Meres reviewed the survey results for the time and format of future meetings. Participants requested the following: meet by Zoom at 6:30 pm
- Survey participants also recommended that the PAC receive the agenda ahead of time. That was done starting with the 11/21 meeting.
- Ms. Meres reviewed the school's commitment to soliciting and parent / family input.
- Mr. Wood noted that the school does take parent input seriously. In the future surveys will be leveraged in the future. For instance, for the multicultural event parents recommended we use the stage and other suggestions that we will try to implement.
- A parent participant noted that the fashion show could use some organizing and perhaps add some dance opportunity. The participant suggested having an assigned volunteer to organize the fashion show. Mr. Wood noted that suggestions will be implemented next year.

# Decision making discussion:


- Admin asked PAC members to evaluate the types of issues that parents want to have input on? For example, perhaps providing input into field trips.
- A parent participant asked if families can provide input on funding utilization and where to leverage resources. Mr. Wood explained that guidelines must be complied with but family input is definitely welcome. Participant asked for information on budget to provide that input and Mr. Wood agreed that he could provide budget information at a future date.

- Ms. Stewart reminded PAC members that the PTO welcomes family engagement.

### House System

- Think of Harry Potter. Houses are set up within grade: Valor, Unity, Radiance and Endeavor. This is
  a way to foster constructive competition cheer each other on. This is part of our positive
  reinforcement system. Star points work great for elementary, but not necessarily in Middle School.
  Student feedback indicated that they didn't feel like they were in Middle School and this might build
  solidarity.
- We want to give recognition to students. Each student will have a personal point system and the students will contribute to a house. The points will earn rewards and privileges for the House and individually.
- Students have been making commercials for the Houses. They are talking about it.
- PAC member suggested that admin consider offering volunteer opportunities or encouraging the Houses to have a service project for the year. In prior years PAC members noted that kids didn't feel like they had structured opportunities for their volunteer hours.
- Students do not choose their House. It's a random selection.
- If this goes well we have talked about incorporating into the Elementary and having sister houses.
- Students will have House meetings, but this will not interfere with academic opportunities.
- PAC participant suggested offering fun opportunities like scavenger hunts.
- The point of House points is to reward good behavior.
- Dr. Nicholson mentioned that Day of the Arts is coming up. When Middle School comes to Day of the Arts, we plan to have students sit with their Housemates to build a sense of community and belonging. There's a lot of excitement around the Houses.
- There will be 2 purchase days (for rewards) a month.
- PAC member asked if parents could sponsor a prize. Mr. Wood will inquire.
- Parent access is by fee and since this is kind of a pilot program for this year we did not opt to pay parent fees. That will be evaluated for next year once we determine if it will be successful.
